

 Building on existing leadership in the practice of socially engaged research across all disciplines by working to enhance York's expertise in the scholarship of engagement.










^{*}Source CiteScore- measures the citation impact of serial titles such as journals. CiteScore calculates the average number of citations received in a calendar year by all items published in that journal in the preceding three years. The calendar year to which a serial title's issues are assigned is determined by their cover dates, and not the dates that the serial issues were made available online.

The SciVal publication database identifies "competencies" as interdisciplinary areas of research strength where York is a global leader.

Distinctive competency means it is a significantly large field of research

Within competencies 3 Leadership criteria are tracked:

"Publication" Leader- high publication output with a larger fractionalized publication count than any other institution in that field.

"Reference" Leader- larger number of highly cited publications that any other institution in that field.

"Innovation" Leader- the recentness of cited publications


Distinctive Competencies must satisfy leadership criteria










• Sponsored research income: includes all funds to support research received in the form of a grant, contribution or contract from all sources (internal and external) to the institution.




